Conductors



Dr. Deborah Simpkin King is a visionary conductor, advocate and educator with a wide reach of influence. She is Founder and Artistic Director of Schola Cantorum on Hudson, a pro-am choral ensemble dually based in NYC and NJ, focused on new music with socially pertinent programming; and of PROJECT : ENCORE™, the international advocacy initiative in promotion of post-premiere performances of new music. Her industry leadership takes such additional forms as her Chairmanship of the New York Choral Consortium (since 2012), Coordination of the NJ-ACDA HS Choral Festival (since 1994), and frequent presentations at professional conferences on new music and on choral consortia. She also serves as Director of Arts Ministries at Trinity and St. Philip's Episcopal Cathedral in Newark, NJ.



Dr. Jason C. Tramm is celebrating his eleventh season as Director of Music Ministries with the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. Sacred music has been central to his career from a very early age, beginning as a 5 year old boy soprano soloist at St. Thomas Lutheran Church in West Nyack, NY. His work in the sacred, symphonic and operatic realms have received acclaim both nationally and internationally. Dr. Tramm currently serves as the Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hall University (where he was named the 2017 University Teacher of the Year), the Music Director of Teatro Lirico D'Europa, Artistic Director of the Mid Atlantic Opera, Music Director of the Morris Choral Society and Artistic Advisor/Conductor of the Adelphi Chamber Orchestra. Dr. Tramm has conducted in many prestigious venues including Carnegie Hall, Merkin Hall and will make his NJPAC debut on October 27 in his highly acclaimed series, "Prayer for Peace." He holds degrees from the Crane School (SUNY Potsdam), the Hartt School (University of Hartford) and a Doctoral of Musical Arts from Mason Gross (Rutgers University). A frequent guest conductor, Dr. Tramm has led performances in Italy, Romania, Albania, Hungary and throughout the United States. The Tramm family is proud to call Ocean Grove their musical and spiritual home during the summer months.



Shea Velloso is an organist from central New Jersey. He is a graduate of Mason Gross School of the Arts where he earned his bachelor's degree in organ performance. In 2004, Mr. Velloso was the recipient of The Elizabeth W. Durham Award for Excellence in Performance. He has performed recitals throughout New Jersey and New York City. He has appeared in concert on the national public radio show "Pipedreams" and on Metuchen Television. As Director of Music at the United Methodist Church at Milltown, he is the organist, director of the church's three choirs and is responsible for planning the church's concert series and Music & Meditation for Lent series. During the summer months, Shea enjoys working as an accompanist and rehearsal leader for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. He also serves as the Dean of the American Guild of Organists: Middlesex Chapter. Shea, his wife Jody, and their daughter Kathryn currently live in Milltown, NJ.

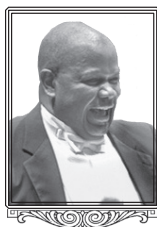
Dr. Cindy L. Bell is a fifth-generation Ocean Grover and appears this evening in her 30th Choir Festival as a guest conductor. In her full-time role as Associate Professor of Music Education at Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY, she directs the University Choir, teaches graduate and undergraduate classes, and coordinates the music education program. A specialist in choral music education and community choirs, Dr. Bell presents workshops for state, divisional and national music education and choral conferences, including NYSSMA, NAFME, ISME and ACDA. She also adjudicates choir festivals for the Long Island Music Festival and guest conducts choirs of all ages, including the 2015 PMEA Region VI High School Chorus in Pennsylvania, and the 2016 Delaware All-State Women's Chorus. She is co-author with her father, local historian Ted Bell, of the 2012 award-winning book *The Great Auditorium: Ocean Grove's Architectural Treasure*. Dr. Bell is a graduate of Lycoming College (PA), Eastman School of Music (NY) and Teachers College, Columbia University (NY), where she earned the Ed.D. in Music Education. She dedicates her appearance tonight in honor of her parents, Ted and Shirley Bell, long-time residents of Ocean Grove.



R. Kevin Boesiger received a Bachelor of Music Education from Nebraska Wesleyan University and a Masters of Music in Music Composition from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. He is the Creative Arts Pastor at Christ Community Church in Beatrice where he has served since 1990. Boesiger was previously the Choral conductor for Southeast Community College in Beatrice where he directed the choir and served as the musical director for their stage productions for 12 years. He has studied with Mark Hayes, Dr. Randall Snyder, Tyler White and Boyd Bacon. Kevin performs, conducts and adjudicates on a regular basis for many community events and schools. He is also the conductor of the Beatrice Regional Orchestra. Kevin enjoys his time as a husband and father of four. He has been married to Tami since 1986. Boesiger is published with The Lorenz Corporation, Hope Publishing Company, Pavane Publishing, Lillenas Publishing & Easy Choir Music.com. He also has new releases coming out with Shawnee Press, Fred Bock Music, Choristers Guild and Hinshaw Music. Kevin will be teaching at the Asian Christian College of Music in Kerala, India for the remainder of this summer.



Dr. Thomas Juneau is active throughout the United States as a conductor, composer and educator. He is Music Director of Summit Chorale and the Juneau Vocal Alliance, as well as Director of Choral Activities at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He has numerous works in publication with Carl Fischer Music, ECS Publishing, Walton Music, Hal Leonard Corporation, Alliance Music and Southern Music Company. He has conducted in major concert halls throughout the United States including Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center.



Dr. Everett McCorvey received his Doctorate of Musical Arts from the University of Alabama and has performed in many cities and theaters across the country and around the world including the Metropolitan Opera, The Kennedy Center, Radio City Music Hall, Teatro Comunale in Florence, Italy, and Queen Elizabeth Hall in London as well as performing in Spain, the Czech and Slovak Republics, Austria, Japan, China, Brazil, Ireland, Poland, Portugal, Hungary, Mexico, Peru and France. He is the founder and Music Director of the American Spiritual Ensemble which has released five cd's and the Artistic Director of the National Chorale of New York City. Dr. McCorvey serves on the faculty of the New York State Summer School of the Arts in Saratoga Springs, NY where he was Artist-in-Residence and served on the faculty of the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria. A native of Montgomery, Alabama, Dr. McCorvey and his wife, Alicia Helm, have three children. Dr. McCorvey believes that every citizen should find ways to give back to his or her community, city or country and is very active in volunteer activities working to keep the arts as a part of the civic conversation and serves on many local, regional and national boards.



Andrew W. Monath is in his 2nd year as Minister of Music at Reformed Church of The Ascension, United Church of Christ. He earned a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from Westminster Choir College and a Master's Degree in Integrated Arts Education from Arcadia University with a concentration in Musical Theater. He is also currently serving as the Choral Director for Middle and Upper School as well as the Musical Director for the Theater Department at Abington Friends School in Jenkintown, PA. He is in his 25th year as a Music Educator and Church Musician. His choirs have sung for festivals and other community events as well as the National Anthem at Citizen's Bank Park for a Phillies Game. In addition to his work in Choral Music, he has directed and produced over sixty plays and musicals with middle school, high school and college aged students.
